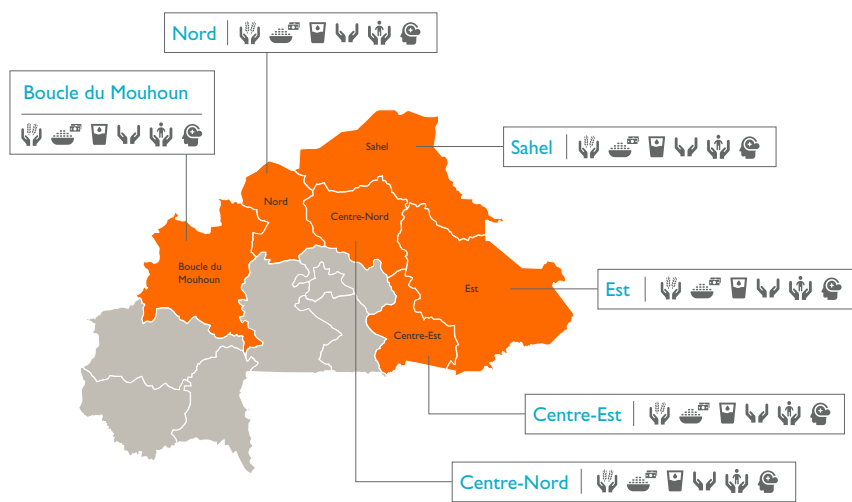
Our reach
